The Canoe Marathon Committee has met recently and discussed how to improve ICF competitions based on Congress decisions and the experience gathered.

NEW WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS COMPETITION PROGRAMME

After Congress approval of 4 new classes for World Championships a new programme was needed. It was both a question of race distances and time schedule.

The race distances

The under 23 classes did not have a defined distance. The intention for introducing this age group was to try to make a progression from being a junior to becoming senior.

It was concluded that the distance for junior women and junior Canadians should be reduced from 5 to 4 laps to allow for the following progression;

COMPETITORS WHO HAVE BEEN LAPPED

The committee discussed the potential for paddlers who have been lapped to finish the race and not complete the whole course like it is seen in other sports.


It was agreed not to have any change this year, but that it should be deferred to further discussion at the Team Leaders Forum at the Crestuma World Championships in September 2009.

COURSE CONCEPT

It was agreed that there would be two possible course concepts for Championships. Both will have start, finish and portage at the same place.

One for <u>regatta courses</u> of 1930m between the turns with 150m turns and one short last lap of 500m between the last turn and the finish. For Kayak Men this will mean a total distance of 30.1 km for the 7 laps. See table above for laps of the other classes.

The second concept would be for <u>river and lake courses</u> and would be the same overall distance but with no short last lap as per the drawings below.



WORLD CUP RULES

It was decided to increase the maximum number of entries for juniors from 3 to 4.

For any race to be included in the point's calculation there would need to be a minimum of 3 boats from 2 nations, see enclosed updated rules for 2009.

Bulletin for the World Cup in Copenhagen 13-14 June has been sent to the National Federations, and for the World Championships 18-20 September it is on its way.
