If any event is oversubscribed they will offer places in World Ranking order and subsequently Nations will be allocated a number of places. #### **Finance**

Andy Koszary stated that the books were nearly up to date. The budget has been readjusted in light in the change in exchequer grant. The accounts are slightly more complicated in light of the England Split.

We have had 3 letters from unfunded paddlers regarding help towards team costs. They will be treated as part of the Team and John McLeod will invoice us direct for the shortfall.

Complaints have been received re the organisation of 2 events

Event 1 The complaint will be investigated thoroughly. The organiser will be sent a copy of the complaint contents for his comments. The Slalom Committee will endeavour to appoint a Jury chair to oversee the next event. *Action JW JWz.* 

Event 2 Again this will be investigated thoroughly. We need to gather further information before any decision can be made.

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A letter has been received over the accuracy in communicating penalties at HPP using keypads this has been passed to Steve Bright and will undergo further study. *Action SB JW* 

Junior Championships - As it is the turn of Scotland to host this event the question has been raised as to whether the J18 Championships should run along with the J14/J16 Championships. It is felt that many J18's do not take the race seriously as to the water it is held on. Rather than moving to a harder site, thus putting many younger paddlers off the Committee after much discussion felt that reverting back to just J14/J16 Championships is the right way forward, the J18 championship could then be contended as part of the UK Championships. To be discussed at the ACM.

A query was received regarding Committee Meeting minutes. It is standard practice to send a copy of the minutes to clubs registered with the Slalom committee. The minutes are also published on the web site. It was felt that if other people required a copy they could be downloaded from there. Next year the minutes will be distributed to the Clubs, where possible, by e-mail.

#### Selection

A letter of apology has been received from the National Water Sports Centre regarding the state of the timing equipment.

It was felt that the Selection Policy needs to be written in a more 'user friendly' way.

#### Timing

After the problems of the other weekend at HPP, it would appear that a great deal of pressure has been brought to bear on HS Sports, and they have strived to improve the system for last week's div1/2. There were few problems last weekend. There were problems with the score board due to hardware failure.

The new mobile system is now up and running, and is being tested at Peterborough. It was given a good shakedown at HPP timing a slalom sprint race and apart from a couple of minor issues, worked very well. Irene is talking about taking it on the road soon and Steve and Sue Bright will support her with this. If all goes well this weekend, it will be used to time the Junior Champs in June.

#### Llangollen

They have been looking at water levels on the Dee and providing the level is such that it will allow a boat to negotiate the weir above the mill then the rest of the course will be navigable. Talks are taking place with the Environmental Agency to find out if they would increase the flow for us if required. At the moment we are hopeful that the event will go ahead.
