Statement by the International Panel

Selection Policy for the Australian Youth Olympics Sydney, Australia 14th – 18th January 2009

The British Canoe Union have been invited to send a Great Britain Team to the Australian Youth Olympics in January 2009, the International Panel are publishing the selection policy below. This policy will be implemented by the International Panel and nominations made to the British Olympic Association for final ratification.

Eligibility: Open to athletes who are Over 16 but Under 19 on 1st January 2009.

Max entry: 1 boat in each class

Selection Criteria:

 Any athlete making the final at the Junior World Championships or Junior European Championships in 2008 will be considered for selection to the Australian Youth Olympic Festival in January 2009.

Where there is more than one athlete making finals in a given class across the two races, the athlete/crew with the highest placed finish across the two races will determine who is selected. In the event of a tie, the best Junior World Championships result will place higher than the Junior European Championships.

Note:

The BCU acknowledges the support of the British Olympic Association in supporting the funding of this race opportunity.

Attendance at the event will be subject to sufficient athletes qualifying to make it worthwhile sending a team.

The International Panel wish all Great Britain Team Representatives an enjoyable and successful 2008 racing season.
